

What was the American Lyceum?




- A civic "classroom"

- Reform-friendly without being radical

What was the American Lyceum?

- A "Community-Owned" institution
- National network, Local Impact
- Boosted public school development
- Training ground for orators
- "Mental Exercise" as entertainment
- Moral uplift was central
- Declined as mass media rose
